

ŻfinMalta presents its first Christmas production with direction and original music performed live by The New Victorians, and choreography by Adriano Bolognino. This dynamic new work is a dance theatre adaptation of the Christmas book, *Holm tal-Milied*? by Trevor Zahra, a classic story many know and love from their childhood and continue to pass on. 'Holm tal-Milied?' is a delightful full family experience, taking audiences on a nostalgic ride, while juxtaposing classic Maltese traditions with a fresh and contemporary musical score and aesthetic. Dramaturgy is by regular collaborator Victor Jacono and for the first time, ŻfinMalta collaborates with set designer Anna Horvath and Laurent Uyttersprot for costumes.

The New Victorians are a high-profile, award-winning sister duo who make music and theatre. Since 2015, they have released two full length studio albums and multiple EPs, opened for multi-platinum artist Anastacia on her Evolution Tour and for the BBC Concert Orchestra in 2019, and repeatedly topped local airplay charts

Adriano Bolognino's extensive portfolio of achievements includes recipient of the Danza&Danza Emergent Choreographer Award 2022, new creations for Kayzer Ballet in 2023 and Compagnia Opus Ballet in 2022. He was selected by the European Dance Network Aerowaves, and in 2020 the Venice Biennale commissioned him to create Your body is a battleground.

In this collaboration with ŻfinMalta, choreographer Ambra Senatore revisits 'Aringa Rossa', first created as a full-length work in 2014. Attentive to a curious, open dance, attuned to the experience of the choreographer and the dancers, 'Aringa Rossa' takes Senatore's compositional style to the extreme, constantly shifting the pieces of an ever more astonishing puzzle. Working with clues, games with changing rules, and fragmented scenes, the dancers eventually take over this meticulous choreography. Working with assistant choreographer Vincent Blanc, this adaptation 'Aringa Rossa .10' is the encounter between the ten-year-old original and the personalities of the dancers.

Ambra Senatore has been director of the National Choreographic Center in Nantes since 2016. Her dance is found in the tenuous space between the construction of action, fiction in rehearsal, and the truth of presence. Underpinning all gestures is the everyday, observed with a magnifying glass, which she shifts and reverses until the gesture becomes fictionalised, until the dance becomes theatrical. Adept at surprises, cuts, and reminiscent of cinema.

CANTATA

ŻfinMalta is thrilled to present 'Cantata' by the inimitable Mauro Bigonzetti. 'Cantata' is Bigonzetti's personal quest to read and recover the traditional musical heritage of Southern Italy. The passionate and visceral gestures of the choreography are evocative of its wild, Mediterranean origins. 'Cantata' is an intuitive dance that stages a continuous game of opposites, sacred and profane, man-woman, sun and moon, love and violence, where music, sounds, voice and body are the main interpreters of the piece.

Mauro Bigonzetti (born 1960, Rome) is one of Italy's pre-eminent dancers and choreographers. His training began at the Rome Opera Theatre, where he studied and worked from 1972 until 1983. The following year he joined Aterballetto as a dancer, where he remained for ten years before leaving to focus on choreography. His first creation, 'Sei in Movimento', was presented in 1990. In 1997, he was named Artistic Director and Principal Choreographer of Aterballetto, a position he held until late 2007. He has since choreographed for companies around the world, including English National Ballet, Stuttgart Ballet, Staatsballet Berlin, Ballet del Teatro Argentino, New York City Ballet, and Ballet du Capitole de Toulouse. In 2016 he directed the Corpo di Ballo del Teatro alla Scala. Most recently, he has staged 'King Lear with the Stuttgart Ballet, performed by Egon Madsen, and 'Madina' at Teatro alla Scala, performed by Roberto Bolle.

FLESH AND STONE

Inspired by the temples of Gozo, this new creation by Canadian choreographer Lesley Telford, explores the echo and enormity of the influence of our mothers. Through her fascination with the myths of the Ġgantija giants of our past, Telford imagines how the power of those who came before us may seem super-human. Starting from the image of the mother goddess, the work questions: How do we fit into the larger-than-life remnants of our past and how do our regular lives, failures and stories relate to this colossal mother image?

Lesley Telford is a Vancouver-based choreographer and Artistic Director of Inverso Productions. Her work has been described as having 'a profound way of tapping into very deep recesses of our emotional and intellectual landscapes'. Lesley danced with Les Grands Ballets Canadiens, Compañia Nacional de Danza in Spain, and Netherlands Dans Theater 1, where she worked with choreographers including Jiri Kylian, Paul Lightfoot and Sol Leon, William Forsythe, Ohad Naharin, Johan Inger, and Crystal Pite and others. She has choreographed new works for Ballet BC, Les Grands Ballets Canadiens, Netherlands Dans Theater 1, Hubbard Street Dance Company 2, Compañia Nacional de Danza 2, Ballet Vorpommern, Pro Arte Danza, and Arts Umbrella Dance Company, among others. She founded Inverso Productions to experiment with other art forms and ways of creating dance.

ŻfinMalta joins forces with Ballet D'Jerri, the national dance company of Jersey Island, in a new work by ŻfinMalta Artistic Director Paolo Mangiola. Twenty dancers come together to explore what unites the two islands through distinctive geographical and cultural landscapes.

Taking inspiration from the Arctic Tern, a bird known for having the longest migratory patterns on the planet, 'Geographers of Solitude' is a conversation on diversity, the fragility of different voices, and fostering collective harmony. Just as these birds take shelter on both islands during their long journey, the dancers on stage explore both itinerant and protracted island life and the dynamic interplay between solitude and communal, on our individual and collective narratives. It delves into the notion of islands as a microcosm of the world at large – a contained environment where its inhabitants develop unique cultures and ways of organising societies.

Mangiola explores how the score, inspired by the film Planetary, informs the dance in dialogue with the themes of ecological and organic systems and our need to move from a society driven by industrial growth to one that is life sustaining. Through this intense dialogue between choreography and music, 'Voices at the end' traverses different moods, from dreamscapes to cities, and the abstract to the concrete, offering its audience an experience that is both choreographically and musically stunning.



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Company Dancers



MARTI BLANCO ROMEU

Born in Barcelona in 2001, Marti started dancing in an elementary school where dance was mixed with music, later he studied at the professional dance conservatory of the Institut del Teatre, Barcelona, where he worked with various guest dancers and established choreographers. Marti graduated in contemporary dance in 2020 and subsequently joined IT Dansa, Barcelona, as an apprentice for the first year and then as a company dancer. During his time with IT Dansa he has worked with an extensive and varied repertoire of choreographers such as Akram Khan, Alexander Ekman, Cayetano Soto, and Ohad Naharin, among others.



PEARL CALLEJA

Born in Malta in 2002, Pearl started dance at the age of five and has trained in classical ballet, contemporary, and Spanish dance. She graduated from Seed Dance Studios in 2019 and furthered her studies in contemporary at DAF (Dance Arts Faculty) in Rome under the direction of Mauro Astolfi. Pearl has worked with artists including Michele Merola, Emanuele Soavi, Roberto Scafati, Francesca Pennini, Roy Assaf, Tania Carvalho, and Emanuel Gat. Pearl was also nominated for the Young Artist of the Year Award in the 2022 edition of Premju ghall-Arti. She joined ŻfinMalta as an apprentice in 2020 and as a company dancer in 2021.



JÉRÉMIE LAFON

Jérémie was born in France and began his dance training at the National Ballet School of Marseille, which he attended from 2014-2017. He graduated from the Paris National Conservatoire in 2020 with a Bachelor's degree, obtained with distinction, and went on to further training with the Ensemble Chorégraphique junior company, and Ballet de L'Opéra National du Rhin. Born in 1993, Keith began his dance training at age 12 under the tuition of Theresa Lungaro Mifsud at The Dance Workshop. He trained in classical ballet in the Cecchetti Method, achieving a Distinction at Advanced 2 level. He also trained in contemporary and flamenco dance styles. Keith joined ŻfinMalta in 2014, and has since performed works by Paolo Mangiola, Jacopo Godani, Jose Agudo, Roy Assaf, Iván Pérez Avilés and Emanuel Gat, among others. Prior to joining the company, Keith graduated from the University of Malta with a Degree in Legal Studies.



LIDIA CARICASOLE

Born in Italy in 1997, Lidia began her dance education at the Vic Ballet Academy in Verona. In 2021, she graduated with a Bachelor of Fine Arts in Dance from The Juilliard School in NYC, under the direction of Alicia Graf Mack. Lidia has performed in repertoire by José Limon, Paul Taylor and Martha Graham, as well as in new creations by Ohad Naharin, Bryan Arias, Spencer Dickaus, Jianhui Wang, Andrea Miller, Matthew Neenan, and Allysen Hooks. Following her studies, Lidia was awarded the Juilliard Career Advancement Fellowship for the years 2021-2022 and 2022-2023, a recognition to students considered of impact for the future of the performing arts. Lidia joined ŻfinMalta in 2022.

PAOLO MANGIOLA. Artistic Director

Paolo Mangiola is a choreographer, dance educator and performer working within ballet and contemporary dance practices. Operating in the interstices between codified dance and ordinary movement, Paolo is interested in exploring this relationship in the context of our interconnected society, drawing inspiration from various artistic sources, the web, and emerging movements.

As a performer Paolo has collaborated with, and danced for, artists and choreographers including Wayne McGregor, Deborah Hay, Martin Creed, and Mauro Bigonzetti. Paolo has created works for the Royal Ballet, Tanztheater Nürnberg, Aterballetto, Szczecin Opera Ballet and Balletto di Roma. He attained a Masters in Choreography at The Place, London, and designed the programme for the Contemporary Dance Department, Scuola del Balletto di Roma. Paolo was appointed resident choreographer at Balletto di Roma in 2015, where he remained for three seasons. Since 2017 he has been Artistic Director of ŻfinMalta, Malta's national dance company.
